Last year, **Young St.** resident Jordan Smith fired 7-10 shots in front of Waikiki’s Club Alley Cat, killing one and injuring two. Police also arrested Smith’s roommate, Isaiah McCoy, for forcibly promoting prostitution.

Later, after a youth stabbed a Marine to death at Royal Hawaiian and Kalakaua avenues, the military designated Waikiki a “high risk area.” Then a midday assault on Japanese tourists led to a Japanese Consulate General warning against visiting Kakaako.

Honolulu’s murder rate, 14 in 2009, hit 32 last year. Rapes in Waikiki-to-Kakaako over the past decade rose from 47 to 66. And Hawaii’s opioid dependency grew from 50,000 to 150,000 residents, sending addiction-related medical costs to \$111 million a year.

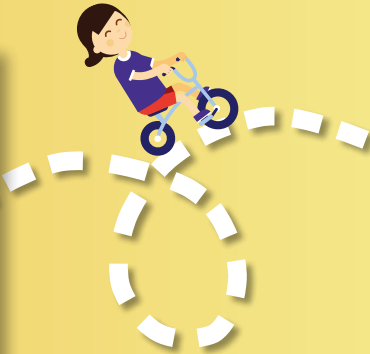

60% to 80% of arrestees test positive for drugs. Most robbers, weapons violators, and burglars are users.³ Addiction is an illness requiring treatment. To identify the addict, Senator Sharon will require compliance with the state's database drug-monitoring program, currently only 10% effective, will fully fund Public Safety Dept's. database, and will allow Health Dept. direct access to individual records.

Treatment is vital to fixing the problem of homeless in parks and on streets. Sharon supports *Housing First*, which houses homeless coupled with treatment.
