Last year, Young St. resident Jordan Smith fired 7-10 shots in front of Waikiki's Club Alley Cat, killing one and injuring two. Police also arrested Smith's roommate, Isaiah McCoy, for forcibly promoting prostitution.

Later, after a youth stabbed a Marine to death at Royal Hawaiian and Kalakaua avenues, the military designated Waikiki a "high risk area." Then a midday assault on Japanese tourists led to a Japanese Consulate General warning against visiting Kakaako.

Honolulu's murder rate, 14 in 2009, hit 32 last year. Rapes in Waikiki-to-Kakaako over the past decade rose from 47 to 66. And Hawaii's opioid dependency grew from 50,000 to 150,000 residents, sending addiction-related medical costs to \$111 million a year.


